From 2015-2019, Dr. Tharp served as the Highly Qualified Expert and the Senior Prevention Advisor for the US Air Force Integrated Resilience Office. From 2008-2015 Dr. Tharp worked in the Division of Violence Prevention at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in Atlanta, GA. At CDC she held the positions of Behavioral Scientist, Senior Health Scientist, and Acting Chief of the Research and Evaluation Branch. She has over 80 publications in the areas of trauma and violence, has made numerous presentations at international, national, state or local conferences or meetings, and has received many awards for her work in violence prevention. Dr. Tharp has provided clinical care and conducted research with survivors of trauma as well as violence perpetrators. Dr. Tharp is a licensed clinical psychologist and Clinical Assistant Professor at Baylor College of Medicine.

Dr. Velgach reported to Accession Policy in September 2018 as the Personnel Research Psychologist in charge of the Testing Standards Portfolio. She manages the testing programs across the services to include the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) and special tests used for accession purposes. She is responsible for coordinating with the Services, USMEPCOM, and Defense Human Resources Activity on implementation and execution of the testing program.

Previously, Dr. Velgach worked as the Manpower Branch Chief for Defense Information Systems Agency (DISA), responsible for managing over 10K military and civilian positions across the Agency and developing strategic metrics and process reengineering for DISA, Workforce Services Directorate. Prior to her position with DISA, Dr. Velgach was the Deputy Director for Navy, Selection and Classification office (OPNAV N132G). In that role she planned, designed, developed and conducted operational analyses and research efforts relating to Enlisted Force Management. She governed rating entry standards, established validation methodology protocols and assessed fit between Sailor and rating match.

Dr. Velgach received her bachelor's degree, Cum Laude, in Psychology with a minor in Business from Loyola University Chicago and her Ph.D. in Industrial/Organizational Psychology from Illinois Institute of Technology. Dr. Velgach is a member of American Psychological Association and Society for Industrial Organizational Psychology.
